RESIDENTIAL SEWER LINE REPAIR AND REPLACEMENT PROGRAM

GENERAL INFORMATION

The Residential Sewer Line Repair and Replacement Program assists low to moderate income homeowners with the cost of repairing or replacing deteriorated private sewer lines at their homestead. The improvements help reduce rainfall inflow and infiltration into the City of Baytown sanitary sewer system. Eligible participants may receive funding to repair or replace the sewer line from the City main to the building edge, including necessary tie in repairs. Assistance is provided through the Community Development Block Grant Program as a five year forgivable loan, paid to the contractor after project completion and City acceptance.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

All homeowners must provide the appropriate documents to verify the following:

1. Homeowner must reside within the Baytown city limits;
2. Homeowner must own and occupy the home as primary residence;
3. Homeowner must show proof that all property taxes and mortgage payments are current;
4. Homeowner does not owe a debt to the City (taxes, utilities, liens, etc.);
5. Homeowner must have received notice from the City of Baytown Public Works Department that their private sewer line requires repair or replacement;
6. **All** members of applicant’s household must be legal residents of the United States; and
7. Homeowner’s household annual gross income must not exceed the below-stated maximum income limits:

HOW TO APPLY

Completed applications must include verification of household income, homeownership, employment, household members, bank statements, current utility bills, tax statements, and other supporting documents. Assistance is provided to eligible homeowners on a first come, first served basis as funds allow.
